Kentucky coffee seeds in the upper row of the nursery contain^d N.E. 2^d from path also some seeds of a tree from Kentucky, said to be handsome, but name forgotten by miss Lewis also Clematis, or Virgin's bower seeds about the 3. springs on V near the road from the river up to the house & at the stone spring.

29. planted a sod of Pennsylvan grass 15 3. square in the North corner of the Nursery.

30. planted 6. Scarlet alpine strawberry roots from M^r Mathon on the lower side of the Pennsylvan tussock, within a few inches
 May. 1. planted 99. autumn red berries from M^r Mathon in the 6. upper row by the fortresses.
