	2	0	0	1	0	1	1	<p>MORE ON THE LOW TEMPERATURES AFTER THE SNOWSTORM OF THE 3RD AND 4TH</p> <p>This was the roughest month on record. 25 inches of snow fell during the month which was another record. On the 8th the most snow ever on record here 23 inches deep. On the morning of the 8th before the snow plows came it was impossible to get to the back place with the truck and it was all the tractor wanted to get through the snow. We left the tractor in the road in front of Mack's' house and walked down to the back barn in snow over your knees. We had to walk to the back barn most of the first half of the month because of the deep snow and drifts.</p> <p>The rain gauge used in observations from 1958 to 1984 was about 2.5 - 3.0 inches square at the top. It was tapered to a smaller size at the bottom that exaggerated the scale more at the bottom than the top. This gauge worked poorly to measure snows particularly if they were more than 3 or 4 inches. This gauge was then replaced with a 4 inch plastic gauge that was scaled in hundredths of an inch on the inside cylinder.</p> <p>25th -- Tornado warning were issued for our area and a rainbow was observed at sunset.</p>
