The world's tallest thermometer

The world's tallest thermometer is a landmark located in Baker, California, USA.

It is technically an <u>electric sign</u>, rather than a tall thermometer; however, it exists as a tribute to the <u>record 134 degrees</u> <u>Fahrenheit</u> (57 degrees <u>Celsius</u>) recorded in nearby <u>Death Valley</u> on July 10, 1913.

It stands 134 feet tall, and is capable of displaying a maximum temperature of 134, both of which are a reference to the temperature record.

History

Approved by San Bernardino County by Planner Nancy Sansonetti, it was built in 1991 by the <u>Young Electric Sign Company</u> of <u>Salt Lake City</u>, <u>Utah</u>.

Location

The world's tallest thermometer is located adjacent to a <u>Bob's Big Boy</u> Restaurant and is visible along <u>Interstate 15</u> in Southern California's <u>Mojave Desert</u> in Baker. Along the interstate, the landmark is visible from three different sides. Bun Boy restaurant went out-of-business after several decades of delighting motorists. The mini-mart at the base of the thermometer was shuttered for a minor violation according to a sign posted on the glass door. A plaque for the thermometer has been removed. Country Store (76 gas station) and Bun Boy motel is still there with the same name.
