WEATHER COLUMN-- T Tornado, Q Thunderstorm, S Squall, R Rain, RW Rain showers, ZR Freezing rain, L Drizzle, ZL Freezing drizzle, S Snow, SP Snow pellets, IC Ice crystals, SW Snow showers, SG Snow grains, E Sleet, A Hail, AP Small hail, F Fog, IF Ice fog, GF Ground fog, BD Blowing dust, BN Blowing sand, BS Blowing snow, BY Blowing spray, K Smoke, H Haze, D Dust

WIND COLUMNS-- Directions are those from which the wind blows, indicated in tens of degrees from true North; i. e., 09 for East, 18 for South, 27 for West. Entry of 00 in the direction column indicates calm. Speed is expressed in knots; multiply by 1.15 to convert to miles per hour.
