

September 29-30, 1924:

Norfolk saw winds reach 76 mph sustained from a cyclone that became non-tropical over the Southeast U.S.

In Fauquier county, four inches of rain fell at Leads Manor on the 29th.

In Richmond county, 4.60" of rain fell at Warsaw on the 30th.

Leeds Manor (4.00"),

Stuart (4.20"),

Urbana (3.80"),

and Winchester (2.05") all set 24-hour rainfall records for September during this tempest.

The moderate flood along the C & O canal created by the cyclone led to an end of boating operations (High).
